City Hall closing starting Monday in response to coronavirus

Payments may continue through window next to south door, other means

ARKANSAS CITY, Kan. (March 20, 2020) — To maintain employee health and help limit the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) locally, the City of Arkansas City will close City Hall to the public starting Monday.

This closure will be for a minimum of two weeks and will be re-evaluated in early April. The City will strive to disrupt services as little as possible during this time through a variety of measures, including telephones; video conferences; and online, drive-through and drop-off methods (*see Page 2 for details*).

There may be some scheduling of appointments for any services that require in-person contact.

"This additional measure is to help protect the health and safety of critical office employees who still need to report to work," said City Manager Nick Hernandez. "They will continue to answer phones and provide services. We are sorry for any inconvenience this closure may cause and hope it is temporary."

Arkansas City Municipal Court has already been suspended for the next two weeks. Critical services such as Fire-EMS, police, sanitation, water, wastewater and other services will continue uninterrupted.

All other City facilities, including the following, will remain closed to the public indefinitely:

- Agri-Business Building, located at 712 W. Washington Ave.;
- Arkansas City Public Library, located at 120 E. Fifth Ave.;
- Cleo Graves Memorial Hogan, located in Ranney Park at 326 E. Poplar Ave.;
- Northwest Community Center, located at 615 W. Birch Ave.;
- Senior Citizens Center, located at 320 South A St. (but meal program is continuing);
- Recycling trailers located at the middle school, Cowley College and Spring Hill Golf Course.

No City parks are being closed at this time, but the City encourages all citizens to follow all health recommendations, including safe social distancing methods, and to refrain from using parks or trails if they are sick. This may be re-evaluated if any positive COVID-19 cases are reported in Cowley County.

- Use the utility dropbox located in the alley east of City Hall to drop off your payment.
- Use the City of Arkansas City dropbox located at the Dillons customer service counter.

For those residents who wish to pay with cash, the following service is available:

Use the walk-up window, located just to the right (east) of the main (south) door to City Hall.

To establish or stop utility service, please call <u>441-4401</u> or <u>441-4402</u> to talk to a customer service specialist, or use the walk-up window. The walk-up window also is available for court payment plans.

Neighborhood Services Division: Building permits, code enforcement, planning and zoning

For building permits, inspections and dropping off plans, all services will be by appointment. Please first call <u>441-4420</u>. You may also email <u>twatts@arkcity.org</u>. Neighborhood Services Division staff then will coordinate with citizens or contractors directly on how to best serve them.

The Meals on Wheels program will continue indefinitely as a curbside pickup or delivery service only.
